A Stewardship for All Season Update

In these unprecedented times, going God's way may be challenging, but it is a challenge that members of Bethany have met head on led by God, our great provider. This past year has seen our congregation accomplish many of the goals set in our Stewardship for all Seasons initiatives. It is utterly amazing what can be accomplished working together and trusting God to provide. While today we reflect on the goals we have met, it is also a time to begin planning to continue *Going God's Way* in the year to come.

Building Connections

Connections have never been more important than now when we are not able to physically worship together. Quality communication is the foundation of strong relationships. During this pandemic, Bethany has been able to improve online worship technology to provide a meaningful worship experience. This allows members to collectively worship wherever they are. Other technology updates have included initiation of online, upgraded website and the purchase of a new laptop computer for Pastor.

Develop Relationships Through Service

God calls us to serve others and Bethany chose to accomplish this by reaching out to the community. Bethany sent funds to the Mauston School district to help offset lunch costs for families in need. Members provided 5 boxes of diapers to Juneau County Family Resource Center and Early Head Start program. Although delayed due to the pandemic, Bethany started free community meals with a drive through community cookout in which over 150 people were served, and 18 home deliveries were made to Bethany seniors. Another drive through community meal will be provided on November 22nd.

Providing A Welcoming Space

The beauty of our church has been increased with the painting of the exterior of the building. This was accomplished through the generosity of members and the Foundation. Updates have been made to the Pastor's office and the main office. Painting of several areas of the interior church has been accomplished by generous congregational volunteers.

Thank you for your continued financial support! Thank you for your time and talents! Thank you for your prayers!! While we have accomplished much, there is much more to do. We strive to continue *Going God's Way* by taking these initiatives into the future. What does that mean? 

CONFIRMATION

There will be a Parent-Student meeting in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesday, October 7th, at 7 pm. We will socially distance and masks are required. We will talk about classes and agree on other specifics. We request at least one parent and the student attend.

We are planning on holding the Confirmation service on Sunday, October 24th. Since we will still be worshipping online at that time, we will record the service with the students who completed Confirmation last spring and their families present and incorporate the rite into our Sunday online worship for extended family members and the Bethany community.

Covid-19 and Bethany

Over the last few weeks, Bethany members have been wondering why we continue to worship exclusively online. So, we've decided to dedicate some time and space to sharing what we are hearing from reliable sources of science-based community health professionals as well as the guidance we are receiving from our La Crosse Area Synod Office.

First, on September 22, 2020 Bishop Jim Arends released this statement to all pastors, deacons, and lay leaders and the congregations they serve:

While the bishop does not make decisions about reopening buildings for any congregation, I do make recommendations based on the knowledge I have from public health officials. Then church councils and pastors make decisions and determine the terms under which they will gather.

The ongoing pandemic requires that we continually reevaluate what are best practices for our congregations. Every time your council meets, it is important to revisit the conversation because the situation keeps changing. While it is tempting to make decisions based on what others are doing, I urge you to make decisions based on care and concern for the most vulnerable among you and to heed the best informed science you can. Remember that most of our congregations' worshiping members would fall into one or more "high risk" categories.

The state of Wisconsin is second only to North Dakota in its rise of Covid- 19 case numbers right now, and La Crosse County has the highest per capita rate in the country. Therefore, it is NOT recommended to meet in person at all right now. If people must meet in person, it should be outside, in very small groups, for under 30 minutes, with masks on and staying at least 6 feet apart. Being inside dramatically increases the risk of spreading the virus.

'Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take to thought what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it

depends on you, live peaceably with all.' Romans 12:16-18 Thank you for the ways you continue to follow Jesus and the compassion and kindness you show to one another.

Similarly, the Wisconsin Council of Churches updated their recommendations on September 21, 2020. Their update begins:

With eight Wisconsin cities occupying positions on a list of the twenty US cities with the fastest rising numbers of COVID cases as of mid-September, we continue to urge caution in gathering the church in physical locations. At this time, we do not advise gathering indoors. Outdoor events are much safer than indoors. Online options are preferred.



September 18, 2020

Dear Friends in the La Crosse Area Synod,

We are living in interesting times. I am glad I have been sharing them with you. It is empowering and hopeful to witness what Christ is doing through us as congregations and as synod in the midst of this pandemic. You continue to ensure that the Word of God is proclaimed to our members, to our neighbors and to the world. You continue to feed the hungry, connect with the lonely, protect the most vulnerable among us, and witness for justice. Thank you for what you do in the name of Jesus.

It is my honor to continue to serve with you beyond my two terms in office. I appreciate the opportunity to be a part of our transition to ministry in an epidemic and divided world. I am thankful that I can aim us toward ministry together with our next called bishop. But it is now time for a change.

Since we began postponing and finally cancelled the 2020 La Crosse Area Synod Assembly, I have been discerning with family, friends, colleagues, and our Presiding Bishop. I have prayed. Through much wise council and with a sense of peace I am announcing that I will retire as Bishop of the La Crosse Area and as a called pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on December 31, 2020. I choose to do so for the wellbeing of the synod and for my health and life as husband, father, grandfather, and one with enough years to follow some wisdom.

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has already begun a search for an interim bishop to serve starting January 1, 2021, until a newly elected bishop can be installed. I will be available to the interim bishop for consultation. Between now and December 31, I will continue my bishop's duties with full focus and will begin guiding the synod's work toward the transitions to come.

I will be forever grateful for the honor of serving as your bishop. The relationships, the ministry, and the opportunities have been blessing after blessing after blessing. Thank you for your partnership over the past twelve years. Thank you for understanding it is my time to retire. Thank you for your prayers for Lynn's and my future.

(cont. from pg. 7) This is Covid-Risk Level Red. The recommendation for virus containment at 25+ is Stay at Home Orders. We know this will not happen in Wisconsin or Juneau County at this time. However, this is one piece of information guiding Bethany's choices. To reach Green Level, we need to reach less than 1 case per 100,000 people and be able to sustain that level for two weeks.

Each Wednesday by 2:00 PM, the Wisconsin Department of Health updates their "Covid-19 Case Indicators" for the previous two weeks. You can find that here: https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/local.htm
Each week, you can find how many new cases have been diagnosed in the previous two weeks. They also report the Burden, which is how many people per 100,000 in population have been diagnosed. In other words, how densely spread the virus is. They also report whether the trajectory is rising, falling, or stable. Finally, they assign an activity level of high, moderately high, moderate, or low.

For example, on September 23rd, Juneau County's numbers were: 82 diagnosed, which is 304.7 per 100,000 in the last two weeks, with a rising trajectory. Which means Juneau County is at High Activity Level.

To consider gathering in person for worship, Juneau County has to sustain Low Activity Level for two weeks. To reach Low Activity Level, the Case Rate per 100,000 is less than or equal to 10 with a shrinking or stable trajectory.

Until we are able to reach and sustain Low Risk Level by one of these metrics, it simply is not safe for Bethany to gather indoors for worship. This summer, we had planned some outside events but members expressed concern about the heat and lack of shade in our parking lot. So, it was decided to focus on improving our online worship opportunities.

We all eagerly await being able to worship together in our building. Until we can do that safely, we will continue to worship online. We continue to be Christ's church in new ways and to care for the most vulnerable among us.

Council Updates Wednesday, September 8 2020

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that Covid-19 numbers are not improving for Juneau County at this time. Public Health experts are cautioning that projects are not good as we look to fall and winter. Pastor named VBS and SAS cookout as successful experiments in adapting ministry to this challenging time. Pastor named her concerns about a lack of engagement from many Bethany members during this spring and summer. Pastor reported that recent worship survey to congregation revealed that members are interested in small group opportunities and are expressing a desire for connection and a sense of community. Council members reported that disengagement has been a problem at Bethany for a very long time. Pastor and Council President encouraged Council members to explore creative ways to engage members in bible study, acts of service, shared interest groups, etc. Council encouraged to see Pastor as a resource, not the sole initiator and leader of these groups and events.

Treasurer's Report

Total Line of Credit balance: \$84,483.16. Bethany received final Payroll Protection Plan Payment of !,880.69. Total amount received: \$18,423.15 Total income year to day, including PPP, is \$103,066.01. Total expenses is \$131,304.78. This leaves a deficit of \$28,238.77. Unbudgeted expense of \$40,057.99 is the cause of this deficit.

Old Business

Bethany continues to follow guidance of state and county health departments and Wisconsin Council of Churches guidance for churches. Masks are required when meeting in the church, per state mask order.

Staying the course with online worship until Juneau County meets benchmarks for low risk.
