

A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

Summer is almost over, the seasons have moved us once again into a time of transition. Soon the children will go back to school and the harvest will come in.

It is difficult to believe that I have now been serving Bethany for almost a year. Last year at this time I was very busy packing my things into boxes, saying hello to you and goodbye to my last congregation, onboarding at Lutheran Social Services, and doing all the other things associated with transition. Transition times for pastors and congregations can be difficult and stressful and I appreciate everything that all of you did to try to make my transition go well.

A lot of things have been happening at Bethany Lutheran Church since I arrived. When I got back here, our congregation had already started to reimagine and revitalize ministries that had gone dormant during the pandemic. It has been wonderful to get to come alongside both leadership and 'worker bees' in this place during this special time of reawakening. There are also other things that Bethany started doing during the pandemic, like broadcasting worship services, that I believe will continue to happen in the future.

It seems to me that Bethany is emerging from the pandemic changed in some important ways but also with a stronger sense of what we value as a congregation. When I listen to you talk about what this time has been like, I again and again hear what people missed during the pandemic more than anything else was the ability to 'be there' for and with one another. You may have heard talk about Bethany adding a "**Pray**ground" to our church, but may not know exactly what it is all about.

In short, a Prayground is an open area near the front of the sanctuary specifically set aside for young children (ages one through eight) to be during the church service.

The purpose of the Prayground is to provide a comfortable space for children to help them feel part of the service; and just as importantly, feel part of the Bethany family.

Worshiping together, regardless of age, gender, race, physical needs, or sexual orientation, is the cornerstone of a loving Christian church. Unfortunately, young children are often left out of that equation.

While there are legitimate questions about distractions and noise from the Prayground during the service, those issues will be addressed. For example; parents are responsible for their children's behavior and will sit near them, there will be no noisy toys, and activities are to be of a quiet nature.

While this a departure from what we consider a "traditional worship space", it is nonetheless, a trend among churches across the United States and the world. With an ever-changing land-

scape in which church participation is decreasing at alarming rates, change is inevitable, especially if we want to remain a viable, vibrant church.

While adding a Prayground is no assurance for an increase in attendance or membership, it is an attempt to be sensitive and intentional in encouraging young families and their children to feel welcome in Bethany Lutheran Church.
