

A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

At some point in the last decade or so I went from a regular consumer of news, 'a news junkie,' to someone who tries to intake a minimum of news, especially world news. I think, for me, this is because all of the news I had been taking in regularly seemed to be 'bad' or otherwise upsetting. There has been a lot happening in the world, in the community, in the lives of our friends and family, sometimes even in our own lives that feels horrible to hear about.

It is understandable that people wonder if we are living in the end times. What do we even say to others when the worst has happened? Why does God allow the things that are happening in the world, community, and to the people we love happen? I have many thoughts on these things and would be happy to sit down, perhaps with some coffee, and chat a bit with you if you find yourself in this space. I do not have any simple answers.

It is a harder task to look around and see God's love at work for us in hard times. Surely love for others is in the willingness of people to respond quickly to disasters. The work of police, paramedics, and firefighters comes specifically to mind. Recently, a member of our congregation experienced a stay at the hospital. When I visited that person, I found that some of you had also been to visit. This caused me to look for other ways that we at Bethany are making a difference. The things that I saw when I started looking for them were amazing.

A few of these things are intentional ministries. Bethany has a formal lay visitation program that has existed for almost as long as our congregation. We call these folks 'beacons.' They are people who intentionally take interest in making sure people who can't get out and about so well anymore get contact from caring members of our congregation. Bethany also has sharing suppers, WELCA circles, a foundation, a memorial fund, people making school kits, etc.

Most of the expressions of God's love that I personally witness within our community are unplanned and informal. God comes to us through one another in powerful, meaningful ways. I do not deny that awful, cruel, and unjust things are happening in the world. However, I think it is a challenge to use, to see, experience, and do our best to be the cause of awesome, loving, beautiful things. God Bless, Pastor Joan

It was fascinating every time I came to Bethany to watch Westside School being turned into a pile of rubble. Cars would park, sit, and watch the demolition. The school obviously meant so much to the teachers and students of Westside. Change is stressful, but the new apartments are needed.

The Church is called to be constantly reforming, and the first step of re-forming is un-forming, breaking down

what has been before, and trying new ways of putting it all back together. It is what Richard Rohr calls the universal pattern—the order, disorder, and reorder that we see in the changing of the seasons, the life and crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.

Deconstruction is the most painful. We would do anything to avoid it, to skip ahead to the exciting phase of rebuilding. But unless we deal with the fatal cracks in the building and clear away the rubble, nothing truly new will ever be built.

The church is always reforming, in every generation and in every season. This can be exhausting when it feels like everything is falling apart. But what if it's a necessary, ongoing part of messily overlapping cycles of change? The Church is bigger than the building, bigger than the congregation or the ELCA. The Spirit moves in mysterious ways, and part of coming together into a new thing is the undoing of old things.

The church is always dying, always rising, because we are—as individuals and as a body—made in the image of a crucified God.

The old is always passing; the new is always coming into being. Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Yes, God is doing a new thing among us! God is in the pile of rubble - God is in the new foundation - And God is in the vision of a future that is only beginning to come into focus.

- High rise toilets have been installed in the bathrooms next to the fellowship hall.
- The items raised from our recent fire inspection have been taken care of, including the recharging of the fire extinguishers and fixing the exit door in the stairway to the basement.
- A new walk-in door has been installed to the storage shed.
- A new "Welcome" sign has been cut out and will replace the current entrance sign to the parking lot once it is painted and ready for installation.
- The committee is continuing to look at options to improve our sound system.
- The next meeting will be November 7th at 5:30 p.m. We will review the proposed budget for 2024, all committees should have their proposed needs in to the office prior to that meeting.
