A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

Easter is usually thought of as an April holiday. This month is unusual for us because the celebration of Easter in on Sunday, March 31st. This is not a calendaring mistake. Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox. Christians have been following this pattern since the Council of Nicaea met in 325CE. Although the date does seem early, my understanding is that Easter can come almost a full week earlier than it does this year. This makes my March feel busy.

As I write this to you, it has just become Lent. This is the season that we as Christians use to prepare our hearts and minds for the celebration of Easter. We have already had some special events like our chili supper on Ash Wednesday and the Valentine's party celebrating the importance of love.

There is more still coming. We will again have Wednesday evening services during Lent. Early in March our congregation is hosting an afternoon at the movies at the Elroy theatre. This event will feature the film, "One Night With the King." This is a film featuring some big-name actors and is based on the book of Ester. I believe that this is a particularly timely film to watch in light of recent turmoil. There are tickets available in the church office. We ask that you get a ticket if you think you might want to come.

The story of Ester is also read aloud yearly in a festival called Purim. This year we will have a model celebration of Purim with a meal featuring some foods Jesus's people eat and an audience participation style reading of the book of Ester. One rabbi has stated that when 'the messiah returns, Purim will be the one feast in Judaism that still needs to be celebrated.' You are invited to come and find out why. In the tradition, Purim is celebrated for around a week. Our smaller model celebration will take place at 6:00pm on Sunday, March 24th. Because of the need for enough of the specific foods involved with this event, we ask that you sign up by March 17th. Look for a sign-up sheet on the kiosk in the entryway.

On Maundy Thursday, March 28th at 6:00pm, we will again have a presentation of the Last Supper, featuring actors from our congregation. We will start recruiting for this project very soon.

I hope that you are able to help, participate, or join us for some of these special events as we again ready ourselves for Easter this year. God Bless, Pastor Joan

Lenten Lutheran World Relief Kits

The Committee approved mission support of \$1000 to the La Crosse Synod/ELCA, \$170 to Lutheran Social Services and \$170 to the Mauston Food Pantry since no payments were made in January.

- Dick reported that Gray Electric installed outlets on the outside of the storage shed and in the Narthex.
- The committee would like to discuss the plans for the basement with the council. This will determine the extent and priority placed on the painting and finishing up the basement.
- Jim Miller will serve as the F & P Committee representative to the Church Council. The next meeting is scheduled for March 12th.

February 2024 Council Highlights

- Pastor's Report: Pastor discussed the March Purim meal. The serving of alcohol was approved. Sheri B. and Elley D. have agreed to work on fixing up the kids' area.
- Worship Committee: Linda shared the plans for the approaching Ash Wednesday and Lenten services. Kathy M will organize the Maundy Thursday reenactment. Liturgy settings will switch following Easter.
- Mission Committee: Kathy M. reported a need to update mission/job description. Dick and Pastor will clarify requirements of Bylaw changes. Several projects are being considered. The Faith Circle has agreed to again manage the School Kits.
- Properties Committee: Jon asked that each committee representative discuss with their committee
 any plans they may have for usage of the basement, as this will determine decisions made going
 forward with finishing work in the rooms and hallways.
