- We received a report from the FDIC with regards to our accounts with Bank of Mauston. FDIC insures
 up to \$250K. Any account funds above that are not insured. We are looking into alternative options for
 this.
- We have received \$11,405 in fundraising contributions for the Asbestos and Sound System projects.
- Special Congregational Meeting April 28th. Standard rules will apply. This meeting is expected to be very brief, as it is a formality required of the Synod.
- Pastor Joan asked if it would be possible to allow a discretionary fund for use as deemed necessary by the Office Administrators. Gary said this could come from Unbudgeted for this year and budget the funds next year. We will provide \$30/month.
- Spring Cleanup is scheduled for Saturday, May 18th, beginning around 9:00 a.m. We're asking for volunteers to stop in to help as they are able. There are many jobs – flower beds, weed trimming, window washing, painting, polishing, etc.
- The Properties Committee is looking for a few individuals that would like to help with developing a plan for the courtyard make-over.
- Faith Development Committee has a Thrivent grant for the college care packages. Donations can be placed in the box in the narthex any time prior to their mailing on April 29th .
- The former nursery area at the end of fellowship hall has been redecorated and is now known as "Kid Connection".
- The last day of Sunday School is April 28th.
- Any members doing Lector readings are welcome to stop by the church during office hours or after services if they'd like to test the new sound system prior to their next scheduled reading.
- Confirmation 1st Sunday in May. Pentecost May 19th. Graduation last Sunday in May.
- Kathy Marose presented the Mission Committee's interest in the Synod Emphasis of "Water is Life". She shared several ways Bethany could play a part in the Water Project.
- July 8th-11th, VBS will have a focus on water, and may conclude with the Sunday, July 14th service being held outdoors at the Riverside Park. The band pavilion has been reserved for this.

April 2024 Finance and Property Meeting

The F & P Committee met on April 9, 2024. The Committee approved mission support of \$500 to the La Crosse Synod/ELCA, \$85 to Lutheran Social Services and \$85 to the Mauston Food Pantry. An additional \$105 was collected for the Food Pantry though the monthly congregational collections.

- The striper and paint have been purchased for painting the stripes on the parking lot.
- Fundraising for the asbestos remediation and the audio system is doing well. \$11,405 have been collected so far. Thank you to all of those who have contributed.
- Spring cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, May 18th. Everyone is encouraged to stop by and help as much as they are able. Some of the jobs planned are cleaning the flower beds and courtyard, washing windows, painting in the basement, weed trimming, and any other things that can be addressed inside and outside of the church. Many hands make light work of large jobs.
- The Properties Committee is looking for 3-5 individuals that would like to help plan the vegetation, ground cover, and use of the courtyard. Please contact the office, or F & P committee member if interested in being on the committee or if you have ideas for the courtyard.
- The committee completed its review of the continuing resolutions and submitted changes for the council to review.
- Several other projects are being addressed.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 7th.

Fundraising Update

Our fundraising program for the Asbestos Remediation and Audio System is off and running. The total of this project is \$52,000 and as a congregation, we are working to raise \$26,000. The Bethany Memorial Foundation has generously agreed to match our giving dollar for dollar to get us to the \$52,000. Pledges can be made by taking an envelope from the white board in the Narthex. Payments can be made by putting your envelope in the offering plate, mailing it in, dropping it off in the office or online through Tithly using the drop down menu item "Sound System/Asbestos Remediation". The number of envelopes on the board changes from week to week as some envelopes are taken as pledges and some are replaced with new envelopes as we convert the dollars to other amounts. For example, a \$500 envelope may be replaced with five \$100 envelopes. The total dollar amount on the board has always been the \$26,000 necessary to achieve our goal amount. After just four weeks of giving we have raised \$13,345. We are off to a great start. The board will continue to be displayed in the Narthex until our goal is reached. Please consider taking 'another \$10' even if you have already given your pledge. Thank you to all who have given, those who have pledged, and those who continue to give.

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry 2023 end-of-year stats are in. We served 493 different families, which contained 222 different seniors, 664 different adults, 359 different children-for a total of 1,245 different people served. We provided up to 14 days of food each month. 157 families only came once during the year and 24 families came each month. All the other families were spread out during the year. We distributed a total 238,691# of food during the year. This does not include the extra 8,000# of limes, cucumbers, pumpkins, and bananas we shared with the community from our 4 "extra" semis who graciously shared with us this year. We also distributed 563 senior boxes with 16,890# of additional food. Items that we need if you are out shopping: soups, canned fruit and canned veggies, canned protein like peanut butter, tuna, chicken. Your cash donations help us to purchase needed food. We would not be here to help those families in need without the generous help of our volunteers and donors. We have a wonderful group of people to work with!
