A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

Once every three years the Lectionary reading cycle (the way we figure out scripture readings for worship in our church) brings us a five week block in which we hear all about bread. From manna to challah bread plays a role in our story. I look forward to us unpacking a little bit about what it means for us when Jesus says, "I am bread."

The Lord's Prayer contains language about 'daily bread.' This is because bread would have been considered a basic necessity. It was something that would have been made daily. No need for preservatives because bread would not typically be made more than a day in advance. Most religions that talk about daily bread will speak about manna. The special flat bread that God sent daily to his people as they wandered through the desert. The concept of daily bread and the spiritual concept of dependence on the divine are also often linked. The idea being that we depend on God not only for our most basic physical needs, but also for the spiritual food we need. We use flat bread in our worship on a weekly basis to remind us of the manna God sent the people.

There is also special bread that is eaten within the tent of Judeochristianity called challah. This is a beautiful breaded bread consumed for sabbath observance weekly and during other religious observances by those with Judean cultural heritage. Challah is the bread that I think about when someone talks about a large golden loaf. Recipes that you may have for Easter bread are likely very close to those for challah. Easter breads are eaten as a reminder of resurrection and new life, one of the most special things modern Christians celebrate. Another way we might celebrate the resurrection with bread is with a hot crossed bun.

I think that these uses of bread remind us about God's love for us in both the ordinary every day and during special celebratory times. I invite you to join us for worship this month to hear much more about the religious significance of bread.

Rules at Plymouth Cemetery have been in place for decades but have been ignored and not enforced until recent months. Please see below the rules, in a nutshell, for Plymouth Cemetery.

- 1. Cemetery is open sunrise to sunset.
- 2. All flowers/decorations must be affixed to the monument or foundation.
- 3. No glass decorations or containers.
- 4. Planting of trees, shrubs or plants is not permitted and will be removed.
- 5. Flowers and decorations will be removed by November 1st and April 1st.
- 6. Anything deemed unsightly or that hinders maintenance shall be removed.

These rules are posted on the fence at the front corner of the cemetery. The enforcement of these rules will help keep the cemetery neat and will also ensure a more efficient, cleaner mowing and trimming job by our subcontractor.

In the upcoming months we hope to finalize plans to reach out to families of people buried at Plymouth Cemetery to straighten monuments that have settled into the ground and level some sunken markers. Plymouth Cemetery is owned and maintained by Bethany Lutheran Church and is the site of our originating roots.

July 2024 Council Highlights

- Council reviewed suggested changes to the Bethany Bylaws. Council will approve any changes at the August council meeting and the congregation will vote on them at the October Semi Annual Meeting.
- The synod has extended the "Water is Life" project until Advent. The project will continue fundraising efforts to meet our goal of \$10 per baptized member.
- The reusable tote bags are still available in the narthex for members to take one or more and use them wherever you shop. A suggestion by Mary Pirwitz is to take a bag or two shopping with you and give them to someone as a gift from Bethany.
- Food Pantry Sunday continues to be a success. This month, \$85 and 50 pounds of food were collected. The kids have been happy to participate in the collection process!
- The outside railing at the Fellowship Hall entrance has been replaced. Jim Miller did an exceptional job.
- Jeri S. shared they have signed up 6 youth ushers for fifth Sundays, with more calls yet to be made. If anyone knows of a youth that is interested, please let Jeri know.
- Diane Huebner has agreed to coordinate the Christmas program again this year!
- The Faith Development Committee is working on updating addresses for our college students for our first mailing in September.
- Working with Juneau County ADRC to get the word out about their food pop-up events. There are flyers in the narthex, and we will be adding flyers to the Community Dinner bags in August.
- Dick Pirwitz asked what we'd like to do to represent Bethany to the family of Suz Smolik-Hagen, who passed away unexpectedly. Following discussion, it was decided to send a \$100 memorial gift to the family.
- Michael Pechman has an official contract! Pastor Joan has signed to be his mentor pastor. Brian and Wendy McGuire will be attending his installation to represent Bethany.

July 2024 Finance and Property Meeting

The F & P Committee met on July 9, 2024. The Committee approved mission support of \$500 to the La Crosse Synod/ELCA, \$85 to Lutheran Social Services and \$85 to the Mauston Food Pantry. An additional \$170 in donations was also collected for the food pantry making a total donation of \$255.

- Fundraising for the asbestos remediation and the audio system is slowing down and we are still several
 thousand dollars short of our goal. Please contribute if you can and thank you to all of those who have
 contributed.
- The status of several other projects were discussed.
- Tim Benson met with the committee and informed them of the rules regarding the use of the Plymouth Cemetery. A sign with the rules has been placed at the cemetery showing the rules. Families will be given until the end of the year to bring their grave sites into compliance.
