A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

To the People of God at Bethany Lutheran Church,

I have had several questions recently about church membership, how it works, etc. This is likely because we just had our semi-annual congregational meeting. I thought that I would take some time to do some explaining about that.

"I heard you say that you don't care whether I'm a member or not. How come you are saying that?" I want people to know that we care about all of the people connected to our worshipping community here at Bethany. I do not ever check a list to see if you are a member, or have been, before making an emergency pastoral visit or even agreeing to officiate at a wedding or funeral service. I do my best to meet the pastoral needs of those connected to our community. It is my understanding that the leadership of our congregation like it this way. I also want everyone to know that they are welcome to participate in the vast majority of our congregation's life without being a member at all.

We do have several types of membership in the Church. The Lutheran Church typically recognizes two types of membership: Baptismal and Confirmed. A confirmed member is a person who has affirmed their baptism usually in a ceremony called Confirmation. A baptized member of God's Church is any person who has ever been baptized. A baptized member of our congregation is any member who has been baptized within the context of our worshipping community or has had their membership transferred to our community of believers. A person cannot revoke or lose their baptized status. Just like there is nothing that a person can do to cause them to lose God's love. We have a record book in the office at Bethany that shows who we know we have baptized and confirmed over the years. Bethany holds baptismal records for many people who are no longer active within our worshipping community as their baptism never goes away and does not expire.

At Bethany you might also hear someone says active or inactive member. An inactive member is anyone with a membership status that is not an active member. An active member of the congregation is defined in our congregation's constitution as having had a minimum level of participation in the life of our congregation recently (based on attendance and giving). Active, baptized members who are not seasonal or associated members are considered voting members or our congregation. Voting members are eligible to hold an elected church office and get to vote at congregational meetings. An associated member is someone who is considered a part of our worshipping community who already is a voting member of another worshipping community. They have all other rights and responsibilities of membership except they do not hold office or vote. A seasonal member is a voting member only during part of the year, typically while they are here.

I hope that this clarifies some of the language about membership that you have heard recently. God Bless, Pastor Joan

Special Community Thanksgiving Eve Service

Join us for a special Community Thanksgiving Eve Service at Bethany Nov 27th, 7:00 p.m. There will be refreshments and fellowship following the service. The offering benefits the Emergency fund and Christmas baskets. This is an annual event hosted by the Mauston Area Ministerial Association.

- The financial audit was completed October 9, 2024. There weren't discrepancies or other findings, although when the written report is received, there may be a recommendation or two.
- Korbin Stalsberg, Bug Stompers, removed 2 hornet's nests outside the church entry and donated to us the \$250 fee. A thank you card was sent in appreciation of their generosity.
- Crandall Estate Gift plans and process: The first Crandall gift in December 2023, was placed in a 12-month CD. This will be maturing 12/15/2024.
- \$200K from general checking is being used to purchase two 6-month \$100K CDs. This will allow us to take advantage of a 4.45% interest rate while a congregational decision is made regarding the best use of this gift.
- Fees for events: Following discussion of the proposed fee schedule policy, a motion was made by Jeri S. to accept the updated policy for the fee schedule.

Mission Committee:

- The Water Project has raised \$1,305 to date. This fundraiser will continue until Advent.
- Bethany will be hosting the distribution site for the Mauston Area Ministerial Assn. Christmas baskets. We are seeking volunteers to assist with assembly and distribution.
- They will be hosting an Angel Tree, where Bethany will be adopting a family in need for Christmas. More details to follow.

Hospitality Committee:

- They will begin planning the refreshments menu for the Thanksgiving Eve service.
- Personal notes were mailed to twelve college students, with positive feedback. Care packages for college students will be assembled Dec. 2nd at 11:30 a.m. Donations are appreciated.
- The next Community Supper will be Nov. 17th, serving hot turkey sandwiches.
- The City of Mauston Holiday Parade is Dec. 7th at 6:00 p.m. See Pastor if there is anyone interested in organizing a Bethany entry.

Worship Committee:

- The Thanksgiving Eve service (Nov 27th at 7:00 p.m.) will be hosted by Bethany. We'll have special music for the youth. We'll need ushers, but no lectors. There will be no Communion at this service.
- Christmas decorating will be on Dec. 5th at 9:30 a.m., with lunch to follow.
- Advent & Christmas schedules remain the same—Christmas Eve services at 4:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.
 Christmas Day service at 9:30 a.m. will be a traditional service with Mark as lay minister. Dec. 29th
 will be a service of Lessons and Carols.
- The complete Kyrie will now be sung by the congregation. We'll still have a song leader for Sundays when Pastor is absent.
- Palm Sunday will be moved one week early. The Passion will be our focus on the Sunday before Easter.

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Joan indicated an uptick in requests for benevolent funds both to the church office and to Pastor. Bethany doesn't provide benevolent funds. The Ministerial Assn emergency funds have been fully spent for this year. One way the Bethany congregation can help is to step up our bell ringing this coming season.
- Faith Development had reached out to Sugar Creek to have them come to Bethany to speak about the camp. Stephanie, from Sugar Creek, will be here December 8th to set up a display and share information with us.

The F & P Committee met on October 8, 2024. The Committee approved mission support of \$500 to the La Crosse Synod/ELCA, \$85 to Lutheran Social Services and \$85 to the Mauston Food Pantry. Additional donations collected for the food pantry had not been determined yet but will also go to the Food Pantry as well.

- The bat removal project has been completed. Ray used 123 tubes of caulk filling gaps in the soffits and gaps in the church. He also did several repairs on the roof and other areas of the church.
- The locks on the front doors have been fixed and operate much better.
- BTU has been contacted regarding the thermostat for the lounge and basement and the committee is waiting for a status report.
- The council is seeking additional bids for flooring in the fellowship hall.
- The committee reviewed the proposed fee schedule for events such as weddings and funerals held at the church and recommended them to the council for approval.
- There is currently an excessive amount of funds in the checking account due to significant undesignated gifts received over the summer. The committee is making a recommendation to the council to purchase CDs with the gifts until they are needed.
- All committees are to submit their 2025 budgets to the treasurer by November 5th so they can be used in the budget making process by the F & P Committee on November 12th.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 12th at 5:30 p.m.
