A NOTE FROM PASTOR:

To the people of God at Bethany Lutheran Church,

It is difficult to believe that February is here. For me, it feels like the holiday season just finished. The end of the holiday season winds some things down here at Bethany. We will put away our decorations and begin to look toward Lent and the Easter season.

This year we are going to be trying something different out for our Lenten season and Holy Week. I want you to be aware of these changes well in advance. I trust that we can work together to make sure that everyone who ought to know about this information gets the word. I am thinking especially of those of you who may travel or host visitors during the Spring holidays.

In the past several years I have heard feedback that people would like to have a Palm Sunday service that is only upbeat in tone, as opposed to the Palm/Passion Sunday we have been doing. I have also heard calls for a resurrection of some of Bethany's Good Friday traditions. In order to facilitate meeting the wishes of both of these groups we are going to elongate Holy Week.

Palm Sunday will be an intentionally upbeat celebration of Jesus' entry into the city of Jerusalem. This will happen on Sunday, April 6th, 2025. Please note this is a full calendar week before what your calendar likely lists as Palm Sunday. We will have palm branches and sing those Palm Sunday hymns.

The following Sunday, April 13th, 2025 we will celebrate what I am labeling Good Sunday. We will focus this Sunday on the passion narrative and remember the sacrifices that Jesus made for us. We will do many of the things we used to do during a Good Friday. This service will be sober and sad. There are some folks within our fellowship who have a great need for the emotional space to connect with the events of Jesus' death. This will be an opportunity to do just that.

The Maundy Thursday service and Easter Sunday services are expected to be at the regular times. We will also be having 7:00 p.m. Wednesday Lenten services.

You will also find some information coming soon about a chance to lean into some scripture verses together this Lent. This activity is meant to be accessible and spiritually useful for people of all ages. The kickoff for this event will involve free ice cream at Culver's!

The Faith Development Committee encourages everyone within our congregation to participate in a simple program meant to assist us in encountering scripture together. This will not take years of academic study or hours of reading. Instead, we will focus on one small piece of scripture every day. There will be journals and other tools available to people who enjoy those sorts of things. But, you will not need to be a writer to fully participate! This activity is suitable and interesting for people of all ages. The journey will kick off with custard at Culver's on Sunday, March 2nd, at 6:00 p.m. Your custard is on us!

Remember the Food Pantry Sunday is the first Sunday of every month. Bring a non-perishable food item that can be collected during offering or make a monetary donation using a provided envelope available on the ushers stand.

- Letter from Ruth Marose: Kathy M. shared Ruth's request for leave of absence without pay while she recovers from her injury in the coming weeks. Kathy explained that she will take over the weekly tasks, including soliciting volunteers to assist as needed during Ruth's absence.
- Worship Committee: Since Christmas Day service was attended by only sixteen, it was recommended to not conduct this service in 2025.
- The committee is looking ahead to the upcoming Lenten schedule. Attendance will determine future scheduling of these services. Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday will be on different Sundays. Further explanation to the congregation will follow.
- Mission Committee: Kathy M. reported on the success of the Angel Tree and the additional family sponsored through the generous donations of our congregation. Thank you to Julie Graewin for taking care of the last-minute shopping for this second family!
- Food Pantry Sunday for January netted 46 pounds of food and \$122 in monetary donations.
- Properties Committee: Jim M. reported the committee reviewed a list of items in need of repair throughout the church. Some items will be actively addressed while others will be tabled due to cost feasibility or further investigation. The purchase and installation of the required Knox Emergency Access Box will be addressed. The committee approved the purchase of a new laptop to replace the one, which has died, used for displaying to the TV screens during church services. We are investigating the use of a Roomba for the sanctuary, as it comes highly recommended by other churches. The fellowship hall carpeting project is on Hold until after the budget approval at the January 19th Annual Meeting.
- Faith Development Committee: Jeri S. reported on the numerous events on the calendar. Keep an eye on the monthly newsletter and church service bulletins for these events.
- Sugar Creek information will be sent home with Sunday School and Confirmation students in the next few weeks. We have a group discount code that parents may use when registering their child. Families do not need to make a payment or down payment Bethany will be billed.
- Sunday School curriculum is being reviewed. Plans are being made for upcoming children's programs in the Palm Sunday/Easter services.
- Pastor's Report: Pastor was approached regarding the possibility of providing a contribution from Bethany
 to help pay for funeral expenses for the young girl who was enrolled in Mauston schools. Following
 discussion, it was decided we would ask the congregation for a free will donation during service on Sunday,
 January 12th.

January Finance and Property Meeting

The F & P Committee met on January 7, 2025. The Committee approved mission support of \$500 to the La Crosse Synod/ELCA, \$85 to Lutheran Social Services and \$85 plus \$122 in donations to the Mauston Food Pantry.

- The committee reviewed a list of items that were in need of repair throughout the Church. Some members
 of the committee said they would look into specific items. Several items were tabled due to cost or lack of
 information.
- The committee will look into the purchase of a Knox Rapid Access Solution Box. The purpose is to provide a
 secure location to store an entry key for the fire department or police to access the building in the event of
 an emergency.
- The Committee approved the purchase of a new computer to use during the church service for projecting the screens on to the monitors during a church service. Dick will take care this.
- The fellowship hall carpeting project is on hold until after the budget approval at the January 19th annual meeting.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 11th, at 5:30 p.m.


